
WHAT IS A DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY?

Developmental disabilities are a diverse group of severe chronic conditions that may include mental retardation, cerebral palsy, autism, epilepsy or other neurological handicapping conditions that impair intellectual functioning and/or adaptive behavior.

People with developmental disabilities may experience challenges with major life activities such as language, mobility, learning, self-help, and independent living.

Developmental disabilities begin anytime during development up to 22 years of age and usually last throughout a person's lifetime.

If you or someone in your life has a developmental disability, you may be eligible for services.

Services are dependent on available funding.

UNION COUNTY DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES PROGRAM

RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

Residential Services are provided through foster homes and group homes that provide 24-hour care for individual with developmental disabilities. These homes provide daily structure and support to individuals who cannot live independently. Available for adults and children.



INDEPENDENT LIVING SUPPORTS

This service is tailored to the needs of the individual and may provide assistance with financial or medication management.

Community inclusion, meal planning, shopping, transportation to appointments, or other supports necessary are offered for those adults who can live alone with assistance.



VOCATIONAL SERVICES

This service can be provided for adults in a supervised environment or in the community with varying levels of support, allowing a productive lifestyle through either paid or volunteer employment.

IN-HOME SUPPORT SERVICES

This program empowers individuals and families to develop and use personalized supports. The intent is for families to be actively involved in resource development for their specific needs. The program attempts to support the entire family and the issues involved in caring for a person with a developmental disability.



CRISIS DIVERSION SERVICES

A backup system utilized for individuals who are in danger of losing current home or at risk of civil court commitment.



EASTERN OREGON SUPPORT SERVICE BROKERAGE

The brokerage can help people to develop a personal plan for support in living an independent life, based on individual wants and needs. They also assist in finding community resources and developing financial and employer-related supports.
